Situated in Nablus, Palestine, ANNU offers a diverse portfolio of high-quality undergraduate and postgraduate programs spanning fields such as Economics, Law, Political Science, Medicine, Biological Sciences, Engineering, Natural Sciences, Religious Studies, Languages, and Social Sciences.

ANNU is dedicated to leveraging modern teaching methodologies and cutting-edge technologies to enhance its educational system, ensuring its graduates are equipped with the knowledge and skills required to thrive in local and global markets. In alignment with its mission to foster sustainability in Palestine, ANNU has

established a dedicated Sustainability Office. This office leads university-wide efforts to embed sustainability principles, raises awareness among students and staff, and collaborates with local, regional, and international partners to drive the achievement of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). A-5 YEAR REVIEW

The Times Higher Education (THE) Impact Rankings are the only global performance tables that assess universities' impact deploying the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals 2030 framework.

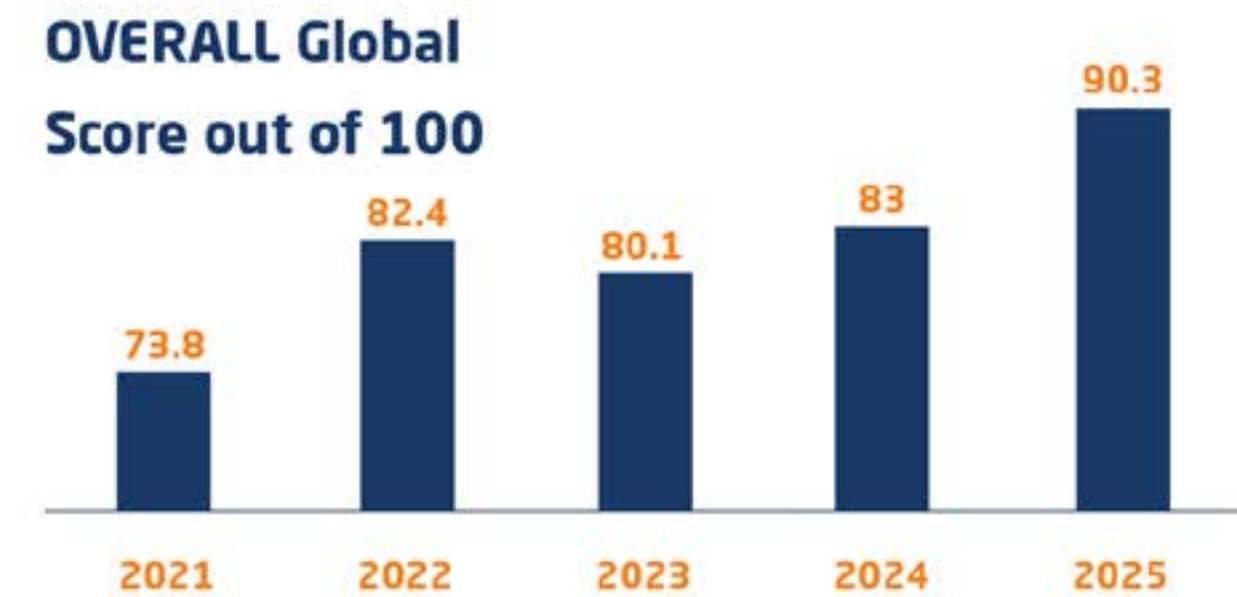
The THE Impact Rankings are the most comprehensive and complex rankings methodology currently available to individual universities across the world. The rankings use indicators across four broad areas - teaching (curriculum), stewardship (operations), research and outreach (engagement) - and include an assessment of an individual institution's policy landscape. Interest in these rankings has grown exponentially since their introduction in 2019. A university's total score in a given year is calculated by combining its score in SDG 17 with its best three results on the remaining 16 SDGs. Each year An-Najah submits against all 17 SDGs.

This is an institutional undertaking and involves input from over all university campuses, faculties, divisions and centers across the university and the submission of over 460 data points and case studies, overseen by Department of World University Ranking team.

Over the past five years, An-Najah National University has consistently led Palestinian universities, ranking first in Palestine and among the top 100 universities globally in the 2025 THE University Impact Rankings. Notably, we have excelled in key SDGs, including SDG 7 (Affordable and Clean Energy), SDG 6 (Clean Water and Sanitation), SDG 1 (No Poverty) , and SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals). These achievements reflect our dedication to impactful change, innovation, and sustainable global partnerships.

Bridging the Gap in Healthcare Access

ANNU's Poor Patient Support Fund provides financial aid to underprivileged patients, ensuring access to medical care. In collaboration with An-Najah National University Hospital, this initiative reflects the university's commitment to social responsibility and improving community health.

Advancing Health Research Excellence

2024 Drug Development Breakthrough

Researchers from An-Najah's Faculty of Medicine, developed AS0369, a novel treatment for the rare kidney disease cholemic nephropathy. In collaboration with German scientists, the drug prevents bile acid buildup, reversing symptoms in preclinical studies.

The strategy focuses on retrofitting buildings to reduce energy consumption, incorporating renewable energy sources like solar panels, and upgrading systems such as HVAC and lighting. This initiative demonstrates the university's commitment to sustainable development and energy conservation.

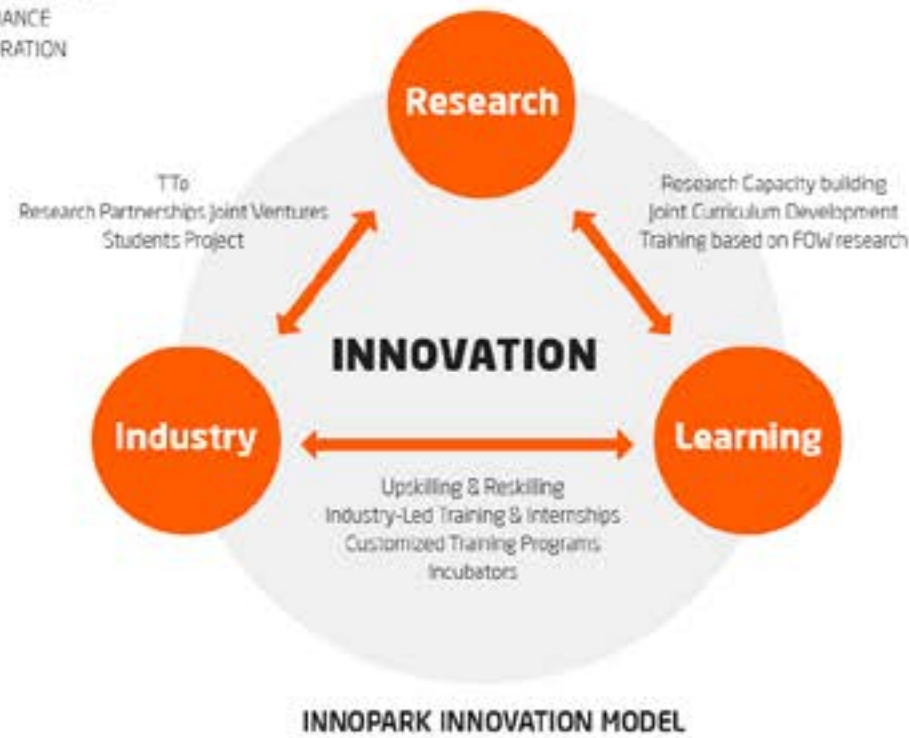

With 95% of urban growth occurring in developing countries and 70% of the world's population forecast to live in cities by 2050, this vision is critical for fostering sustainable, inclusive, and resilient urban futures worldwide.

Signed Agreements around the World

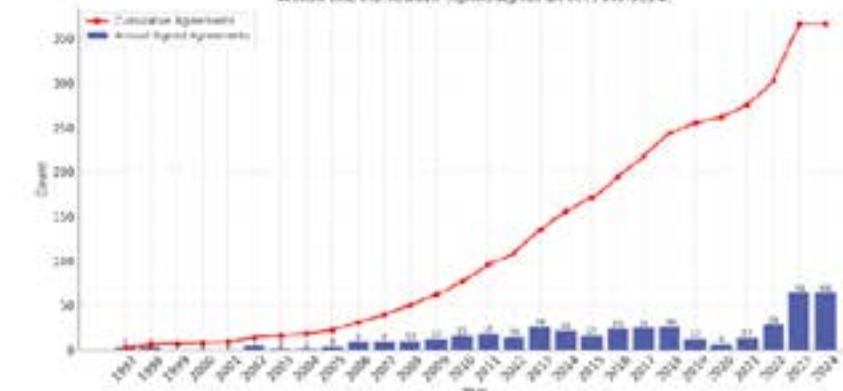
