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Historical Overview

Welcome to our prestigious academic institution. With nearly 100 years of experience, we are leading the field of higher education in Palestine and the wider Arab world with international-level research and instruction. Additionally, An-Najah uniquely contributes to the economic and societal development of Palestine through a cadre of specialized scientific centers which provide vital services to the community that are otherwise unavailable. We furthermore cultivate a multicultural, pluralistic outlook among our students through a number of initiatives designed to foster cross-cultural dialogue and tolerance.

An-Najah National University began as An-Najah Nabulsi School in 1918. In 1941, it became An-Najah College and in 1965 began to offer intermediate university degrees in academic fields that aimed at enhancing the quality of education in Palestine. In 1977, it transformed into An-Najah National University, joining the Association of Arab Universities as a full member in 1978.

Today An-Najah is the largest and most prestigious Palestinian university with 17,807 students and 1,020 academic personnel spread across three campuses: the Old Campus; the New Campus; and the Khadouri Campus in Tulkarm, which houses the Faculty of Agriculture and Veterinary Medicine.

Widely considered the foremost Palestinian university, An-Najah ranked first in Palestine and 1906th in the world in Google Scholar Citations according to the Webometrics Ranking of World Universities (December 2015). This ranking is a proud testament to An-Najah's commitment to promoting world-class scientific research and development.





Commitment to International Standards of Education & Research

Recognized and accredited by numerous international associations and agencies, An-Najah has several centers and offices dedicated to internationalizing the quality of instruction and research. The university actively recruits highly qualified academic staff and also internally develops its best graduates, who are provided with scholarships to pursue postgraduate studies at universities in the United States, Europe, and Asia.

International Accreditations

An-Najah National University is a member of the International Association of Universities, the Association of Arab Universities, the Mediterranean Universities Union (UNIMED), and the Agence Universitaire de la Francophonie. An-Najah has submitted itself to additional international evaluations and accreditations:

Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET)

Established in the United States in 1932, ABET is a non-profit and non-governmental accrediting agency for academic programs in the disciplines of applied science, computing, engineering, and technology worldwide. An-Najah has obtained accreditation for 7 programs according to the same criteria and standards used to evaluate American universities.

European University Association: Institutional Evaluation Program

The Institutional Evaluation Program (IEP) provides external evaluation of institutional structures and decision-making processes. It aims to enhance governance and the effectiveness of strategic management. In an unusual move, An-Najah has chosen to be evaluated a second time several years after our first evaluation. This reflects our relentless commitment to improving our academic performance.

European Foundation for Quality Management: Committed to Excellence Certificate

The European Model of Excellence is one of the most important models of quality practices in Europe and the rest of the world. The Committed to Excellence Certificate independently assesses and validates efforts by organizations to implement improvement projects.

International Medical Education Directory (IMED)

Graduates of the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences are able to sit for the United States Medical Licensing Examination (USMLE).

General Medical Council (UK) List of Acceptable Overseas Medical Qualifications

Graduates of the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences are able to sit for the Professional and Linguistic Assessments Board (PLAB) examination in order to practice medicine in the UK.

International Association for the Exchange of Students for Technical Experience (IAESTE)

IAESTE provides students in technical fields with paid, course-related training abroad.



Center for Excellence in Learning and Teaching

The Center for Excellence in Learning and Teaching promotes collaboration between trainers from internationally renowned centers of excellence and An-Najah faculty and researchers. In order to facilitate the university's transition to a learner-centered paradigm, the center provides professional development programs in three key areas: course design, pedagogy, and assessment methods.

Deanship of Scientific Research

The Deanship of Scientific Research organizes, coordinates, and supports scientific research, focusing on the immediate and long-term needs of Palestinian society. In order to encourage research in both the humanities and natural sciences, An-Najah publishes two scientific research journals and awards two prizes for excellence in research.

Office of International Development and External Affairs

The Office of International Development and External Affairs promotes, coordinates, and maintains ties between An-Najah and international institutions. In addition, it facilitates the visits of foreign guests and delegations for the benefit of bilateral and multilateral cooperation. As part of its responsibility to ensure the internationalization of the university, the office also recruits international faculty and staff and pursues international scholarships for An-Najah students.

Erasmus Mundus European Exchange Program

An-Najah is an active participant in the Erasmus Mundus program. Erasmus Mundus promotes cooperation and mobility between universities in the European Union and universities around the world.

European Union Tempus Program

Tempus aims to exchange knowledge and know-how between European universities and institutions in partner countries. Projects seek to help develop curricula, enhance university governance, and address issues relevant to higher education and society.

Quality Assurance Unit

The Quality Assurance Unit encourages self-evaluation in every aspect of the university's performance. The unit assists both academic and administrative departments in these endeavors and also supports the implementation of the university strategic plan.

UNIMED Regional Office

An-Najah is the host of the only UNIMED office in the Middle East. Faculty of Graduate Studies

The Faculty of Graduate Studies encourages and broadens the intellectual and professional maturation of graduate students. The faculty supervises 55 graduate programs, including the only two Ph.D. programs in Palestine (Chemistry and Physics). Supervision of the doctoral students is done via a cooperative process between professors from An-Najah and other institutions in Europe.



Faculty of Honors

The Faculty of Honors offers additional courses to intellectually challenge the university's top students. The faculty works with external professionals to design learning experiences that meet students' needs and interests.



Scientific Centers

In addition to the teaching and research activity that typically characterize a university, An-Najah National University uniquely serves the community through a number of highly specialized scientific centers which pursue responsible socioeconomic development.

Working closely with both the public and private sectors, the scientific centers facilitate the application of academic research to societal problems. Projects in areas such as renewable energy and conservation, toxicology research, and disability have become an indispensable feature of the work and profile of An-Najah.

Public Health and Human Rights Center

The Public Health and Human Rights Center promotes regulations and laws to guarantee the rights of patients and ethical medical practice in Palestine. The center conducts research, hosts workshops, and launches awareness campaigns for this purpose.

Business Innovation & Partnership Center

The Business Innovation and Partnership Center cultivates partnerships with the industrial sector to utilize the university's scientific expertise to stimulate innovation and development in the private economy.

Child Institute

The Child Institute seeks to improve the quality of life for children with all types of developmental disorders through excellence in education, research, health care, advocacy, and support. The institute is the first center of its kind in Palestine where evidence-based assessment, diagnosis, and management services are provided. Programs of note include a specialized rehabilitative day program for children with Autism Spectrum Disorder and a full-day Montessori Kindergarten. The Child Institute is dedicated to the ideals of inclusion for all the children of Palestine

Community Service & Continuing Education Center

Although operationally autonomous, all sub-units work to apply theoretical sociological approaches to practical issues facing the community.

■ Community Service Unit

The Community Service Unit is open to members of the general public in need of social or legal services. In order to teach students the value of voluntary community service, the unit also administers the mandatory community service course which requires that all An-Najah students complete 50 hours of volunteering in the community.

■ Continuing Education Unit

The Continuing Education Unit holds seminars, conferences, and training courses to develop expertise and professional skills within the local economy.

■ People with Disability Care Office

The People with Disability Care Office ensures that access to education and training is a universal principle, enabling employment, societal integration, and economic independence.

■ Computer Lab for the Visually Impaired

This lab provides comprehensive services to those with impaired vision, offering access to customized computers and other supportive equipment, such as braille, large print, raised letters, and audio material.

■ Academic Program for the Study of Involuntary Migration

The Academic Program for the Study of Involuntary Migration conducts research, teaches courses on forced migration, and collects statistical data.

■ Opinion Polls and Survey Studies Unit

The Opinion Polls and Survey Studies Unit conducts surveys on a range of political, economic, and social issues within Palestine, providing periodic reports both in Arabic and English.

Energy Research Center

The Energy Research Center conducts research, system design, feasibility studies, and training in both conventional and renewable energy, as well as energy management and conservation. The center has established a strategic partnership with Arizona State University to develop clean energy projects and research exchange.

Forensic Medicine Institute

The Forensic Medicine Institute provides medical expertise in the fields of judicial autopsy and crime scene investigation.

Korean-Palestinian IT Institute of Excellence

The Korean-Palestinian IT Institute of Excellence offers distinguished professional training courses primarily in operating systems, programming languages, applications, multimedia, databases, hardware, and networking to government ministries, private companies, banks, and other organizations.

Poison Control and Chemical /Biological Analysis Center

The Poison Control and Chemical /Biological Analysis Center analyzes the safety of food, water, drugs, cosmetics, detergents, and other chemicals for public consumption and use. The center also provides accessible advice on poisons, toxins, poison prevention, emergency treatment, and the safe use of medications.

UNESCO Chair on Human Rights & Democracy

The UNESCO Chair on Human Rights and Democracy engages in human rights education, research, and advocacy to provide support and resources to the local community.

Urban Planning & Disaster Risk Reduction Center

■ Urban and Regional Planning Unit

The Urban and Regional Planning Unit aims to improve and support urban and regional planning practices amid the increasing pace of recent development in Palestine.

■ Construction & Transportation Research Unit

The Construction and Transportation Research Unit works with government agencies to improve construction techniques and materials, to manage traffic for Palestinian transport systems, and to establish maintenance and rehabilitation programs for Palestinian road networks.

■ Earth Sciences & Seismic Engineering Center

The Earth Sciences and Seismic Engineering Center was established to increase Palestinian expertise in seismology, seismic engineering, and related fields. The center assesses the earthquake vulnerability of existing structures and uses mass media to increase public awareness of earthquake hazard and preparedness. Additionally the center analyzes seismic data for prospective development plans.

■ Architectural Conservation Unit

The Architectural Conservation Unit works to preserve cultural and historic sites in Palestine by raising public awareness, providing consultation services, and working with governmental agencies.





Water & Environmental Studies Institute

The Water and Environmental Studies Institute researches the optimal use of two of Palestine's limited natural resources: soil and water. The institute aims to assist in environmental preservation, improve the efficiency of water use in agriculture, and minimize ground water contamination.





University Library System

An-Najah National University Library maintains a diverse and constantly expanding collection of books, encyclopedias, periodicals, and other e-resources to foster creativity and meet the information needs of all users. The library integrates cutting edge electronic services with traditional media.

The Library System contains over 250,000 books and 27,000 journals, as well as more than 170,000 electronic books, all available to students, staff, and the

community. Additionally, visitors to the library may access the internet for free.

The following libraries, distributed across the university's three campuses, comprise the An-Najah Library System: the Old Campus Library, the New Campus Library, and the Faculty of Agriculture and Veterinary Medicine Library.

Multicultural Study Centers & Programs

An-Najah has developed several specialized centers and programs to promote interaction and mutual understanding between the university body and the global community.

American Corner Nablus

Sponsored by the U.S. Consulate in Jerusalem, the American Corner Nablus exists to maintain an open dialogue on issues of mutual concern to both the American and Palestinian peoples. The center hosts workshops, open discussions, lectures by guest speakers, digital video conferences, and other activities to build bridges of understanding and to develop students' general knowledge and skills.

American Studies Minor

The Department of English offers an American Studies Minor open to students in all fields of study. Students can study and research topics in American history, culture, literature, and foreign policy. The program encourages the development of international knowledge to prepare students to participate in the global community.

Arabic for Non-Native Speakers

The Arabic for Non-Native Speakers program aims to help learners not only develop their Arabic language skills, but also to understand every aspect of Arab heritage. Instructors try to limit the learners' use of their native language as much as possible. Through this method of immersion, the program strives to enable students not only to learn Arabic but to think in it as well. Outside of the classroom, learners engage with Palestinian society, sharing life together and building friendships with local students at An-Najah as well as in the community of Nablus and beyond.

British Council Office

An-Najah hosts an office of the British Council in the Old Campus Library. The British Council provides information and advice about UK education and the requirements for studying in the UK. It also arranges activities in the arts, education, human rights, and governance to promote cultural dialogue.





Discover Palestine

In 2015 An-Najah launched “Discover Palestine,” a 9-week online course exploring Palestinian history, archaeology, culture, and heritage in the English language. Discover Palestine is a free massive open online course (MOOC) which not only offers online learning, but also gives participants a forum to exchange knowledge with individuals from across the globe. Participants study a different topic each week followed by interactive activities, debates, and research opportunities.

Language Resource Center

The Language Resource Center provides students and researchers with the opportunity to learn a variety of languages via the assistance of international staff. The center contains a library of books, journals, and electronic resources including films, recorded programs, CDs, and other material.

Zajel International Youth Exchange

The Zajel International Youth Exchange program brings young people from all over the world to Palestine to promote cultural exchange, challenge existing perceptions of Palestinians, and equip An-Najah students to recognize and respect different opinions, religions, and cultures.



Media Center

The Media Center is dedicated to the study of media and communication and in doing so reinforces the values of justice, equality, pluralism, democracy, freedom of speech, and human rights in Palestine.

The center inculcates a professional code of ethics to teach students how to produce objective news, analysis, interviews, and programming. The center is working to create a professional journalistic culture that involves marginalized groups of people, appreciates the value of science and culture, supports the rights of women and children, and contributes to the building of a free and stable nation.

An-Najah Broadcasting Channel (NBC)

The center has recently established the An-Najah Broadcasting Channel (NBC) to spread An-Najah's vision worldwide and convey a positive image of Palestine and its culture. NBC broadcasts political, economic, and social programs on television and also offers practical training to media students.

Voice of An-Najah

The Media Center also hosts the "Voice of An-Najah" radio station which broadcasts 24 hours a day on the internet and local frequencies which currently cover about 90% of the West Bank. The station provides professional training to media students and produces a variety of programming on topics ranging from news to music.





University Hospital

The An-Najah National University Hospital seeks to improve the quality and efficiency of medical services available to the public and to simultaneously train professionals for the Palestinian healthcare sector. It is the first university teaching hospital in Palestine.

Although construction is continuing, the main building is now open. The hospital offers services in radiology, oncology, hematology, dialysis, surgery, bone marrow transplantation, laboratory analysis, emergency care, and intensive care. All services meet the highest tertiary level.

By establishing a modern facility to host qualified experts, services, and the latest technologies in medicine, An-Najah aims to attract expert health service providers at home and abroad to train specialists locally in Palestine. By creating a hub for medical services centrally located within the northern West Bank, the hospital will reduce costly patient referrals to hospitals outside of Palestine and promote Palestinian self-sufficiency.

The University Hospital aims to conduct informed, socially aware medical research that abides by international ethical standards in regards to the protection of human rights and the general welfare of individuals.



The City of Nablus

An-Najah is located in the prominent West Bank city of Nablus, approximately 63 kilometers (39 miles) north of Jerusalem.

Strategically positioned in the narrow valley between Mount Ebal and Mount Gerizim, Nablus is an important cultural and commercial hub for the Palestinian people. It is one of the oldest cities in the world and contains architecture from Roman, Byzantine, Crusader, and Ottoman times. The Old City of Nablus dates back to the Mamluk dynasty, offering visitors a chance to experience a traditional Middle Eastern souk reminiscent of that period.


